

# The Covenants of Scripture

| COVENANT  | REFERENCE  | TYPE/SIGN  | TERMS AND FULFILLEMENT  |

| <b>Edenic Covenant</b>  | Gen 2:16-17  | Conditional  | Promise of divine fellowship based upon obedience in the Garden of Eden. Ceased upon Adam's sin.  |
| <b>Adamic Covenant</b>  | Gen 3:14-19  | Conditional  | The conditions God pronounced upon fallen man's life. Will only end in eternity in heaven.  |
| <b>Noahic Covenant</b>  | Gen 9:16   | Unconditional--<br>Rainbow (Gen. 9:17)                     | God's promise to never destroy humanity through a flood. The sign is a rainbow. It emphasizes the preservation and dignity of human life as seen in the institution of capital punishment. Continues until the end of the 1,000 year Kingdom. |
| <b>Abrahamic Covenant</b>                                     | Gen 12:1-3<br>Gen 13:14-17<br>Gen 26:3-4<br>Gen 28:13-15 | Unconditional--<br>Circumcision<br>(Gen 17:11)             | Promises to Abraham, Isaac, Jacob, and his posterity consisting of blessings, a special nation, and a land. Partly fulfilled; awaits final fulfillment in the 1,000 yr. Kingdom.  |
| <b>Mosaic Covenant</b>  | Ex 19:5  | Conditional--<br>Sabbath                                   | Theocratic law code specifically for Israel. Conditioned upon obedience. Fulfilled in Christ's sacrificial atonement.   |
| <b>Land Covenant?</b><br>(Addendum of the Abrahamic Covenant) | Dt 30:1-10   | Unconditional  | Promise to the nation of Israel to receive full possession of the land guaranteed by God in the Abraham. Ultimately fulfilled during the 1,000 year Kingdom.  |
| <b>Davidic Covenant</b>                                       | 2 Sam 7:12-16  | Unconditional--<br>Christ will be seated on David's Throne | Temporal and eternal rule of David's posterity ultimately fulfilled in Christ during the 1,000 year Kingdom.  |
| <b>New Covenant</b>   | Jer 31:31-33<br>Matt 26:28<br>Heb 13:20                  | Unconditional  | Blessings for the church now and Israel during the 1,000 year Kingdom, based on the sacrifice of Jesus Christ.  |
